Fees ... invoices and how to make your payments

Currently our fees are £5 per hour (subject to change.) Invoices are issued termly and payment can be made by cheque, cash, BACS or Childcare Vouchers. For those children who are eligible for the Nursery Education Grant (the term after their child turns 3) https://www.stockport.gov.uk/free-30hrs-childcare/free-30hr-childcare-information-for-parents Pre-School will sort the relevant paperwork for you, all that is required from you is a signature.

A typical day at Pre-School

Opening hours ...

Morning sessions run from 9.15 - 12.15 Afternoon sessions run from 12.30 - 3.30 All day runs from 9.15 - 3.30

Routines of the day ...

The children when in session are split into 3 learning groups which rotate round the rooms and outside play spending 45 minutes in each area. A heathy snack is provided during time spent in the main room. Our "teaching" is delivered through "In the moment planning" where "teachable moments" are discovered through the child's play. This unique way allows us to develop each child at their own individual pace working with their interests. This also allows us to steer the child lead play into which objectives we wish to be assessing the children on. The spontaneity of the planning also enables us to keep enriched by what the children "see" and are fascinated by . . . Who can say what a child wants to explore tomorrow or even in the next five minutes! . .

Facebook

Ratios

Under 3's we have 1 member of staff to every 4 children and over 3's we have 1 member of staff to every 8 children.

Weekly emails

Parents are sent weekly emails about what has happened at Pre-School that week. These can also be found on our website and notice board

Drop off and pick up

Arrive 10 mins before the start time and allow the same at the end of the session. A staff member will open the door when it is time to come in.

What you need to bring
